#### Principal's Report

Hello students, parents, carers, staff and community members,

Welcome back to school for another term of opportunities. At Butchers Creek State School, we 'Strive as one!' This motto means that we are one class, striving to achieve academic and social greatness, we are one staff striving to develop and implement effective systems and practises and we are one community striving to build a culture that creates a positive and productive school environment. This is what the motto means to me but what does it mean to you? I would love to hear how you envision 'Strive as one, 'and what you see our school community becoming through collaboration.

The 2023 School Opinion Survey (SOS) opened on the 24th of July. The survey link will be automatically sent to all staff, students in year 5/6 as well as some select families. I appreciate you taking the time to complete the survey and give your feedback so that I can review it and inform some of the key improvement strategies for 2024. The closing date will be August 18th. Keep an eye out in your emails as you may be receiving an invitation to complete the SOS.

This Term the revised Department of Education Strategic Plan 2023-2027 was released to schools for implementation. The plan directly links to the Equity and Excellence school priorities document with key focus on Educational Achievement, Wellbeing and Engagement and Culture and Inclusion. At Butchers Creek School we will unpack the system initiatives and explore how we can put the strategy into action in our school. Along with the revised plan, the regional office has undergone a restructuring and the Assistant Regional Director roles have been placed with School Supervisors. This role will be responsible for providing differentiated support for every school, targeted to their context and needs. This week, I will be attending the Principal Business Meeting to meet my new School Supervisor and learn about the new delivery of support from the region. I will invite the supervisor to come for a school visit in the coming weeks and there will be an opportunity for our P&C to meet with them as well as students, staff and families.

Thank you to the P&C for everything you have done to get the new shade structure complete over the June/July school holidays. It is a mighty structure that has provided rain and sun cover over the past 2 weeks. A special thank you to Gillian Hinrichsen and Troy Barnes for getting the ball rolling in 2023. It can be a long process to apply for a grant and then organise the work to be complete, and you both have seen it through to the end. We are very grateful for your efforts!

You may have already see my email about the Butchers Creek Hall Centenary event which is happening in February 2024- next year! Hall Meetings are the first Wednesday of each month. Please come along if you are available.

Payment can be made in advance ie. per term- 10 weeks, by transferring money directly to the P&C A/c. BSB: 633 000 A/c: 125 570 424




#### Term 3

We will need some parents to volunteer for Term 4. Please contact Jes or Courtney if you can cook and serve tuckshop one week next term so we can start the planner.






PRIOR TO FRIDAY TUCKSHOP

#### **Term 3 Science**

This term, all students are learning an Earth and Space unit.


P-2 are studying a unit called "Changes around me" where they learn about the observable features of a variety of landscapes and skies and describe the changes that can occur, including weather.





The years 3 & 4 have a unit called "Spinning Earth" where they learn about the movement of Earth to suggest explanations for everyday observations including night, day, sunrise, sunset, shadows and seasons.

The years 5 & 6's unit is called "Our Place in the Solar System" where they describe key features of the solar system; describe how scientific developments have affected people's lives and helped us solve problems and inform decisions.





#### **Term 3 The Arts: MUSIC**

Students will be studying music for both terms 3 & 4.

**P-2** music unit is called "<u>Different Places</u>" where they explore a range of songs, rhymes and chants based on the theme of different places including their personal and familiar world; people and places far away; weather, seasons, landscapes and the built environment as stimulus for music making and responding.

The **years 3 to 6's** unit is <u>"Let's Celebrate, Let's Remember around the World"</u> where they explore the elements of music to develop aural skills; develop skills in composing, singing and playing music; share and record music compositions and performances; and identify purposes and meaning of music. They will make music and respond to music exploring the songs used in celebrations and commemorations including music for special occasions around the world, as well as exploring the music-making of other cultures.
